Job Description

Serving in the Interpretive Department, the Heritage Intern will assist with organizing tours, developing and delivering educational programs, responding to public inquires, and leading event day activities. They will also work closely with the Education Manager to spearhead two heritage projects. The first will be to organize, catalogue, and archive Cape Jourimain's collection of natural and cultural artifacts and create a full digital inventory of its collection. The second will be to redevelop the history-section of the Cape Jourimain website to make it more thorough, accessible, and historically accurate. In addition to the above duties, they may also be responsible for assisting the Education Manager with supervising junior interpreters.

Staff will have the opportunity to participate in special events at the centre, including our 2019 speaker series on climate change, a festival of historic arts and crafts, and the 150th celebration of our on-site lighthouse.

Qualifications

The ideal candidate will be mature, responsible, and resourceful, with the ambition to tackle new challenges and take the lead on projects. They must be well organized and have proficient time management. Experience with writing and research is essential. Must be comfortable with public speaking and working in a team environment. The ability to effectively communicate in both English and French is considered an asset.

A recent graduate in a history-related field (such as archaeology, anthropology, ethnobotany, museology, or other related subjects) would be preferred. Professional experience in a museum or archive, or prior experience in a supervisory position, would be considered an asset. In addition, certification in First Aid and possession of a valid Class-5 Driver's License would be considered an asset.
